Numbers: 31 and above

- 31: treinta y uno
- (numbers 31-99 follow this same construction)

- 80: ochenta
- 90: noventa
- 100: cien





Some rules about numbers

- For numbers that end in *uno* and precede a noun, you must change the ending to agree with the gender of the noun. Use *un* for singular masculine nouns and *una* for singular feminine nouns.
 - Hay **cuarenta y un** estudiantes en la clase de matemáticas. *There are forty-one students in the math class.*
 - Hay **sesenta y una** profesoras en esta escuela. *There are seventy-one female teachers in this school.*
- For numbers greater than 100, use *ciento* plus the number.
 - Hay **ciento** quince personas mi clase. *There are one hundred fifteen people in my class.*





Phone numbers in Spanish



- To ask for a phone number in Spanish, you say:
 - ¿Cuál es tu número de teléfono? *What is your phone number?*
 - ¿Cuál es su número de teléfono? *What is your phone number (formal)?*
 - When answering, many Spanish speakers group their phone numbers in double digits. For example:
 - 319-489-1172
 - *(Mi número) es **tres, diecinueve, cuatro, ochenta y nueve, once, setenta y dos.***
