-AR ending

-ER ending

-IR ending

Conjugations of regular -ER verbs



How to conjugate: -ER verbs

Let's look at the steps for how to conjugate the verb
COMER (*to eat*) in the present tense.

Paso 1. Start with the infinitive verb: **COMER**

Paso 2. Take off the **-ER** ending: **COM-**

Paso 3. **Add the corresponding ending from the chart on the next slide** based on the subject/person



Regular -ER verb endings



	Singular	Plural
1st person	(yo) o	(nosotros/as/es) emos
2nd person	(tú) es	(vosotros/as/es) éis
3rd person	(él, ella, elle, Ud.) e	(ellos/as/es, Uds.) en



Conjugations of **COMER**



	Singular	Plural
1st person	como	comemos
2nd person	comes	coméis
3rd person	come	comen

Some examples



Mis compañeres de apartamento y yo **comemos** tacos todos los martes.

My apartment mates and I eat tacos every Tuesday.



With the verb **BEBER**:

Bebo café por la mañana.

I drink coffee in the morning.
