What is el imperfecto?

The imperfect tense in Spanish is used to talk about **past actions** that were **habitual**, **repeated or ongoing**. It is also used to **describe** people and places or set a scene in the past.

For example, "I **used to play** in the park every day," would use the imperfect tense to show that this was a repeated activity in the past.





Paso 1. Take off the -AR ending of an infinitive verb

Habl**ar**-> habl-

Paso 2. Add the appropriate ending based on the subject

Yo habl <mark>aba</mark>	Nosotros hablábamos
Tú habl <mark>abas</mark>	Vosotras hablabais
Ella habl <mark>aba</mark>	Ellos habl <mark>aban</mark>





To describe **habits or repeated actions** in the past.

Mi hermano siempre nadaba en la piscina durante los veranos. My brother always swam in the pool during the summers.

To set the scene in a story by describing the background, such as the weather, a person's mood, or the setting. El sol brillaba, y los pájaros cantaban.

The sun was shining, and the birds were singing.



To talk about **ongoing or continuous situations** in the past. Yo hablaba por teléfono y los niños jugaban.

I was talking on the phone and the children were playing.
