# Time for more *pretérito*



Remember that the **preterite** tense in Spanish is used to talk about completed actions in the past.

We have learned how to conjugate regular preterite verbs that end in **-AR**.

<b>-AR Verbs</b>	
Yo habl <b>é</b>	Nosotros habl <b>amos</b>
Tú habl <b>aste</b>	Vosotras habl <b>asteis</b>
Ella habl <b>ó</b>	Ellos habl <b>aron</b>

Now it's time to learn how to conjugate regular preterite verbs that end in **-ER** and **-IR**.



# How do we form *el pretérito* with regular –ER and –IR verbs?

**Paso 1.** Take off the –ER or –IR ending of an infinitive verb

- Vivir-> viv-

**Paso 2.** Add the appropriate ending based on the subject. Note that –ER and –IR verbs share the same endings in the preterite.

<b>-ER &amp; -IR Verbs</b>	
Yo viví	Nosotros vivimos
Tú viviste	Vosotras vivisteis
Ella vivió	Ellos vivieron

# Some examples

Ayer **corrí** en el parque.

*Yesterday I ran in the park.*

Anita **devolvió** el juguete porque no le gustó.

*Anita returned the toy because she didn't like it.*

Mis hermanos y yo **abrimos** nuestros regalos anoche.

*My siblings and I opened our gifts last night.*
